National Taiwan Normal University Department of Chinese – "Shi Yi-Zhong Scholarship Guidelines"

Approved by the 11301 Student Affairs Committee on September 3, 2024 Ratified by the 113 Academic Year Scholarship Management Committee on March 18, 2025

1. Purpose:

This scholarship is established in memory of Mr. Shi Yi-Zhong and to promote Chinese classical culture.

2. Eligibility:

Undergraduate students of the Department of Chinese.

3. Number and Amount of Scholarships:

A total of 10 recipients, each awarded NT\$10,000.

4. Application Qualifications and Criteria:

- (1) Applicants must be currently enrolled undergraduate students in the Department.
- (2) Priority of selection is as follows:
- 1. Students from low-income, lower-middle-income, or financially disadvantaged families.
 - 2. Overseas Chinese students.
- 3. General students.
- (3) Applicants must have achieved a GPA of 3.38 or above in the previous semester.
- (4) Applicants must not be recipients of other university scholarships during the current semester (excluding the STAR Scholarship and Academic Excellence Scholarship).

5. Application Period and Procedure:

- (1) The scholarship is open for application once per academic year, during the second semester. Students must apply within the application period announced by the Department.
- (2) Applicants must submit the following documents:
 - 1. Application form.
- 2. Proof of low-income or lower-middle-income status, certificate of financial hardship issued by the village chief, or certificate of special family circumstances issued by the

social affairs bureau of city/county governments.

3. Transcript of the previous semester.

6. Review Committee and Procedure:

Applications shall be reviewed and approved by the Department's Student Affairs Committee.

7. Fund Management and Usage:

The scholarship fund shall be deposited into the university's endowment fund. Both the principal and the accrued interest shall be used for scholarship disbursement.

8. Implementation and Amendment:

These guidelines shall take effect upon approval by the Department's Student Affairs Committee, ratification by the University Scholarship Management Committee, and final approval by the University President. Amendments shall follow the same procedure.
